



Following on from our earlier adventures playing cricket at the top of the highest mountain in Africa, or crossing a continent, the third installment of Madness will involve a race across South East Asia, using a wide variety of transportation modes. A cross between Wacky Races and a Top Gear challenge if you like.

Each player will undertake a series of challenges to earn points towards the Champion's trophy, including Tuk Tuk racing, Quad Bike racing, kayaking, cycling, language and general knowledge skills, culinary finesse and many other challenges.

However, the ultimate goal is not just to be the winner of the challenges. It is to raise money for the two charities we are supporting, Cancer Research and The McGrath Foundation. These two charities do amazing work and really need our support.

Each player will pay for 100% of the cost taking part in the challenge themselves. They will then be asked to raise as much sponsorship as possible for the charities. Help will be provided to raise money, and there will be points on offer towards the champions trophy for those that excel at fundraising.

Players can opt to do the whole challenge (3 weeks) or just to do leg 1 (10 days) or leg 2 (10 days). There will be prizes for leg 1, leg 2 and the whole race.

The race is designed to cover as many of the most beautiful parts of these three lands as is possible, whilst providing a physical and mental challenge all the way around the course.


In addition, there will be two games of cricket played on each leg, so four games in total. Three international caps will be on offer to players.

Day 1: Thailand Arrive Chiang Mai (-/-/D)

START of leg 1

As you arrive in Chiang Mai, our guide will assist you with your luggage and your transfer and check-in at your hotel. You can take some time to relax and rest before the journey will begin.



In the evening we will have a welcome dinner to celebrate the start of this Adventure!

Each player will be collecting points toward the champions trophy. This will include points for the various tuk tuk, quad, cycling and kayaking races, local knowledge and language quizzes, cooking competitions, photography competition, volleyball challenge and other challenges undertaken along the way.

You will be provided with a list of Thai and Laotian words and phrases that may be useful across this journey. You will be tested on these, earning points towards the Champions Trophy

Day 2: Thailand Chiang Mai Tuk Tuks - International Backpackers XI vs Madness XI (B/-/-)



TukTuk Training day!

We will leave the hotel after breakfast today and drive to the country side where the Thai TukTuk’s are based. Spend the day learning to drive a TukTuk while visiting the local sights in the area.

We will play our first game of cricket, a Madness XI vs an International Backpackers XI.

Overnight in Chiang Mai CH Superior Room

Distance and journey time: Hotel – Mae Wang: 1 hour 45 min

Day 3: Thailand Chiang Mai – Chiang Rai**(B/-/-)**

Early departure on our first full day on the road. Transfer to the Tuk Tuks start and begin the ride from Chiang Mai to Chiang Rai, scoping out some sights along the way.

In the evening the Thai language quiz will be held, earing points towards the Champions Trophy

Overnight in Chiang Rai, Laluna, Garden Bungalows

Distance and journey time:

Chiang Mai to Chiang Rai by TukTuk: approximately 270 KM – 8 hours

Day 4: Thailand Chiang Rai – Chiang Khong Tuk Tuk**(B/-/-)**

Get more rural today leaving Chiang Rai in the morning and heading towards the border of Thailand.

Overnight in Chiang Khong Namkhong Riverside, Standard Accommodation

Distance and journey time:

Chiang Rai to Chiang Khong by TukTuk: approximately 150 KM – 5 hours

**Day 05: Thailand – Laos Chiang Khong – Huay Xai – Ban Lad Khammouan
Speedboat and Hiking****(-/L/D)**

Cross the border from Thailand to Laos at around 0800 am at Huay Xai.

Upon reaching the Laos border a new guide will be there to greet you and escort you to your private speed boat. The Mekong River, Asia's 7th longest river, is referred by Laotians as "the mother of waters". This trip will give you the chance to truly experience life along this mythical river.

Continue your cruise down river to the village of Ban Lad Khammoune.

Lunch upon arrival

After lunch, you will experience authentic untouched village culture, where the river is the only access to the outside world. No roads, cars, bikes, mainline power or phones. You have the opportunity to try your hand at traditional crafts where we will have a hands' on craft challenge!

Points towards the Champions trophy will be on offer for your 'traditional crafts results.

Overnight at homestay (Basic)

Distance and journey time:

Transfer by boat: 6 - 7 hrs

Day 06: Laos Ban Lad Khammouan – Ban Kok Kham Kayak (2 person)

(B/L/D)

Pack up your belongings and enjoy a typically local breakfast, which will be followed by guide briefing on kayaks, equipment and safety procedures.

Then we'll depart for Ban Kok Kham around 15kms downstream and taking approx. 2 hours. You'll be accompanied by a local fisherman in a support boat with all your gear who knows this section of the river like the back of his hand. Lunch is enjoyed on an isolated riverbank beside a stream or at the village. After lunch we visit the school and trek the short distance up to the water fall. At 1400 we set off downriver for the campsite passing Ban Lad Hane and around 1600 we will stop for the night on the sand beach opposite Ban Kok Kham, where the villagers will help us to prepare the camp, and collect fire wood to prepare our BBQ dinner.



Kayaking from Ban Lad Khammune to Luang Prabang is an explorer's trip of a lifetime. The Mekong on this section is only a Grade 1-2 river, but depending on the season can sometimes prove more challenging in parts, due to the sheer volume of water. This can also make for effortless paddling.

Overnight camping along the Mekong riverbanks (Basic)

Distance and journey time:

Kayaking: approximate 6-7 hrs / 30 KM

Difficulty: Hard

Day 07: Laos Ban Kok Kham – Pak Ou Caves – Luang Prabang Kayak**(B/L/-)**

After Breakfast, we'll head downstream in the kayaks to Luang Prabang stopping off at the famous Pak Ou Caves, formed in the wall of a karst mountain at the confluence of the Nam Ou River and mighty Mekong.



For lunch, we cross over the river to a restaurant with a picturesque view of the caves. After lunch we depart for Wat Dom Koom, a small deserted temple on an island in the middle of the Mekong. We'll have time to stop for some refreshments.

We'll arrive at the pier in Luang Prabang by mid-afternoon. Once you arrive, you will see your driver waiting at the pier and escort you to the hotel where the rest of the afternoon is free at leisure.

Late afternoon take part in Laos' special Baci Ceremony. The Baci ceremony is performed in celebration of an important event, such as a wedding, birth, or for welcoming guests, and is a means of expressing goodwill and good luck to others. The Lao believe that each person has 32 spirits which constitute their spiritual essence and the Baci is the ritual used to call back any escaped spirits into the body.

Late afternoon meets a cooker from that local family at the Phosy market and then you will do market tour and buying all the ingredients after at all and transfer to the family and you will learn and experience the way of life, the family culture and tradition with this lovely family. Start to learn the traditional way of cooking sticky rice and cooking bamboo shoots, along with other traditional cooking methods. Enjoy your lunch with them and enjoy drinking fresh Lao Lao whisky as it made from sticky rice. Mr. Liam (our Michelin -starred chef) will be the judge of this typical Laos Cook-off!

Overnight in Luang Prabang, Sala Prabang Hotel, Classic Room

Distance and journey time:

Kayaking: Approximate 4 hrs / 10 Km

Day 08: Laos Luang Prabang – Vang Vieng**Quad Bikes (2 person)****(B/-/-)****01 Quad Bike per 02 Pax**

After breakfast, depart Luang Prabang for the spectacular drive to Vang Vieng. A stop will be made in Kasi, a famous fruit growing region. Additional photo stops can be made upon request, as the region is naturally stunning. Please be aware, the road from Luang Prabang to Vang Vieng is mountainous and quite serpentine.



Upon arrival to Vang Vieng, check in to the hotel and soak up the brilliant landscapes that illustrate the town.

The remainder of the day is free at leisure with the guide available throughout the afternoon. Don't forget to catch the sunset over the Nam Song River!

In the evening the Laotian language quiz will be held.

Overnight in Vang Vieng, Thavonsouk Resort & Hotel, Garden view room

Distance and journey time:

Luang Prabang – Vang Vieng: approximately (230 km / 6 hours)

Day 09: Laos Vang Vieng – Vientiane	Quad Bikes	(B/-/-)

After breakfast, begin by Quad bike the drive to Vientiane. Upon arrival, check in to the hotel and enjoy the remainder of the day free at leisure. Take a stroll along the bustling riverside area or do some shopping in the evening markets.

Vang Vieng – Vientiane (160 km)

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Fly from Laos to Cambodia.

Today arrive in Phnom Penh International Airport by flight (VN 921 VTEPNH @ 1135 - 1305). **(only for pax joining leg 1 and 2 – price for the flight is in the costs section)**


New arrivals for leg 2 either fly to Vientiane and take the flight with us at 11.35 or meet us in Phnom Penh.

START of leg 2



Warmly greeting and welcome you by our guides and tuk tuk driver there, who will with you over this journey of nearly 1,000 kilometers. Transfer through the burgeoning town to Cambodia’s capital city “Phnom Penh”. Legend has it that Phnom Penh was founded by Lady Penh, who was gathering firewood along the banks of the river, and spied a floating koki tree and fished it from the water. Inside the tree she found four Buddha statues and one of Vishnu. The discovery was taken as a divine blessing, and to some a sign that the Khmer capital was to be brought to Phnom Penh from Angkor. Lady Penh proceeded to build a small mountain to enshrine the statues that still exist today on top of Wat Phnom, one of the attractions we’ll be seeing tomorrow.

The capital of Cambodia from 1432 to 1505 and then abandoned for 350 years until 1866, the city is noted for its beautiful and historical architecture and attractions. Phnom Penh was once considered as one of the most beautiful cities in the Orient, and despite its recent turbulent history, it still retains



a colonial charm. Cambodia’s capital is a bustling city, majestically located at the confluence of the mighty rivers of the Mekong and Tonlé Sap. Wide tree-lined boulevards and many colonial-era buildings reflect the glorious days and add to the allure of the city, where Asian and Western traditions meet in a fascinating way.

This afternoon it’s time to join the locals for a few games of volleyball. Almost a national sport, volleyball is played everywhere in Cambodia. Superseded perhaps only by

football, this is truly the national pastime. This evening, we’ll mix teams, locals and visitors alike. Winners get a prize, and the prize will be the joy of winning! Please enjoy Volleyball Cup!

This evening stroll along the riverfront from your hotel to a nice local welcome set dinner at the **Bopha Titanic** right on the river.

Each player will be given a Cambodian and Thai language sheet with helpful words/phrases. You will be tested on these, earning points towards the Champions Trophy

Overnight at Phnom Penh, FCC, Deluxe Room

Distance and journey time:

Vientiane – Vientiane Airport (4 km): 15 min

Day 12: Cambodia Phnom Penh – Cricket Cambodia XI vs Madness XI (B/-/-)

Breakfast at the hotel, then free at leisure for your Cricket day!

MADNESS VS CAMBODIA

Overnight at Phnom Penh, FCC, Deluxe Room

Day 13: Cambodia Phnom Penh – Kampong Thom Tuk Tuk**(B/-/-)**

Today we start by taking the back roads out of the modern capital of Cambodia – Phnom Penh for about 45 km to the town Oudong where we branch off towards Phnom Prah Reach or Oudong Mountain, once the capital of Cambodia. The 400-plus steps to the top will get the legs working overtime, but the view is worth it! This ride gives us a chance to see rural Cambodia - stilted houses, rice paddies, ox carts, waving children and of course the friendly Khmer people.



There are plenty of opportunities to shoot pictures along beautiful stretches of the Tonle Sap River. We'll stop for lunch along the way.

Afterward we'll make our best speed where we will finish for today and then transfer to Kampong Thom.

Distance and journey time:

Transfer: 160km - 3-4 hours by tuk tuk with several stops

Cambodia

Day 14: Cambodia Kampong Thom – Siem Reap**Tuk Tuk****(B/-/-)**

Today we avoid to some of the poorer roads in Siem Reap province by transferring 85km for one and half hours to an ancient bridge at Kampong Kdei, one of the best examples of the remaining 800year old bridges in Cambodia. Continue to transfer another 31Km to Domdek village and continue your 66km challenge through the historic highway connecting the province of Kampong Thom and Angkor Wat. We stop and have lunch in local restaurant. After lunch we continue our challenge to hotel.



Overnight at Siem Reap, Somadevi Angkor Hotel, Deluxe Room

Distance and journey time:

Transfer: 155km - 3-4 hours by tuk tuk with several stops

Day 15: Cambodia**Angkor Wat****Tuk Tuk****Foot****(B/-/D)**

Wake early and head out to the temples by tuk tuk. Before the tour begins, stop off at a modern pagoda to receive a blessing from the monks there, wishing for good health and a safe journey.

Afterward the tour of Angkor begins at the ruined walls of **Angkor Thom**, the last capital of the Great Khmer Empire under the reign of Jayavarman VII. This city is surrounded by an 8 m high wall, drawing a perfect square. Enter the city through the ancient South Gate, an impressive stone gate carved with Elephants and four giant faces. On each side of the entrance path a row of 54 gods or demons is holding the sacred Naga snake.



From here, continue to **Bayon Temple** in the exact center of the city. This 12th century masterpiece is a study in grandeur and is well-known for its 54 towers with enigmatic faces representing the 54 provinces of the Great Khmer Empire. The Terrace of the Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper King are also must-visits as they are both known for their intricate bas-reliefs.

After Bayon it's on to **Ta Prohm**. Ta Prohm is unique in that it has been left largely as it was found: overgrown by jungle trees and vines, with many parts of the temple crumbling to the ground. This makes the 'Tomb Raider Temple' one of the most picturesque and memorable of the Angkor temples.

Take a break for lunch at a nearby restaurant with pleasant views of **Srah Srang**, a manmade reservoir and ceremonial bath for the ancient kings.

After lunch it's time to head for the granddaddy of all temples: The magnificent **Angkor Wat**. Built during the reign of King Suryavarman II in the early 12th century, Angkor Wat is constructed following the model of the temple mountain symbolizing Mount Meru, the home of the gods. Inside the temple, the walls are covered with stone carvings and bas-reliefs depicting Hindu mythology and the wars Suryavarman II fought during his reign. Angkor Wat is well known for the more than 2,000 Apsara dancers decorating the temple. Construction is thought to have taken around thirty years of intensive labor. Today, Angkor Wat is figured on Cambodia's national flag as the temple symbolizes the soul of the Khmer people.

In the late afternoon, you will enjoy a new challenge: **A real Cambodian Food Cook-off!** You will form into multiple teams and, after some instruction from the expert Cambodian Chef, each team will create their best version of a Khmer specialty. Afterwards, there will be a tasting session by the local Cambodian chef and their crew as well as Mr. Liam to decide on the winning team. The higher your ranking in the art of cooking Khmer delicacies, the higher your points to add to your Tuk Tuk Challenge competition score. Good luck!

Overnight in Siem Reap, Somadevi Angkor Hotel, Deluxe Room

Distance and journey time:

Transfer: 30km to visit Angkor Complex

Day 16: Cambodia**Siem Reap – Bantey Chhmar****Tuk Tuk****(B/-/-)**

Breakfast at the hotel, today take a short ride via tuk tuk to the village of Kro Bey Real, which lies thirty or so minutes outside of town. In this area are a few families who still practice the art of **basket weaving**. We'll start with a short lesson and demonstration on how to make the basket, then each team will be given the chance to make their own. It's harder than it looks!

When class is over it's time to get serious about moving. Step aboard the tuk tuks and head onward toward to Bantey Chhmar temple. This is the real "Indiana Jones" or "Tomb Raider" experience, stunning ruined temples without the hordes of people associated with the more famous Angkor Wat complex.



Along the way there will be chance to stop and observe local life outside of Siem Reap. Sometimes curious locals come by to have a look; don't be shy! Try saying hello in Khmer!

Overnight Homestay at Bantey Chhmar, (Basic). In the evening the Cambodian language quiz will be held

Distance and journey time:

Transfer: 150km - 3-4 hours by tuk tuk with several stops

Day 17: Bantey Chhmar – Sisophon – PoiPet Border – Prachin Buri Tuk Tuk and Transfer (B/-/-)

After breakfast at local, continue tuk tuk ride to Poipet border, crossroads of National Road No 5 and National Road No 6. Far from a tourist destination, this small city mainly serves as a link between the Poipet border crossing with Thailand, the quiet temple of Banteay Chmar to the North, and Battambang to the South. Nevertheless the Sisophon represents a prime example of a typical Khmer township.



It's time to get serious about moving. Step aboard the tuk tuk and head onward toward to Poipet border via Sisophon.

Arrive border, it's time to say goodbye from Cambodia and Cambodian team. After crossing border, your Thailand team will await and greeting you for others challenges.

Welcome (back) to Thailand! After we clear the border our cycling team will be waiting for you and we'll have a transfer to Prachin Buri where our hotel is.

Overnight in Prachin Buri, Ban Suan Dok Mai ROH Room)

Distance and journey time:

Transfer: 107km – 2.5-3 hours by tuk tuk with several stops

Border to hotel: 1 hour 30 min

Day 18: Thailand Nakorn Nayok

Cycling

(B/-/-)

Today we're jumping on the bikes! Time to challenge those legs as we're riding out of Prachin buri along twisty paved and dirt roads. We have a good 96 KM to go today so get ready for some sweat! No steep climbs today but some gently gliding hills across scenic plantations and rice fields.



Our end station today is around Klong Tha dan dam, Thailand's largest dam. Overnight in Nakorn Nayok, Phu Lyra, ROH Room

Distance and journey time:

Cycling: up to 96 KM / approximate 8 hours Difficulty: Medium

Day 19: Thailand Chachoengsao – Bangkok

Cycling & Transfer

(B/-/-)

Early breakfast today as we're heading out at first light to stretch those legs one more time. Enjoy the scenic roads in the morning and the fresh air while cycling along the rice paddies and local canals. As the day goes further we will reach Chachoengsao which marks the end of our bicycle trip. Having done 185 KM in two days, we hope in the van for the final stretch into BKK to avoid traffic and to preserve those legs for the final game of cricket tomorrow.
